God gave Noah instructions to build a mighty ark. The ark was to be 450 ft. long, 75 ft. wide, and 45 ft. high.


Noah was to fill the ark with two of every kind of animal and bird, male and female, and every living creature that moved along the ground. Noah and his family were to live in the ark with the animals.

Noah opened a window in the ark. He sent out a raven, but it kept flying back and forth over the water and could not find a place to land.




Then Noah sent a dove to see if the waters had gone down. But it could not find a place to land because the waters had not gone down. It returned to the ark.
