The dictionary defines "interruption" as something that causes a delay or stops an activity from continuing.

DAY 1 INTERRUPTIONS

Should Christians say "yes" to every interruption?



Jesus did not respond to every interruption with a "yes".



"Very early the next morning, long before daylight, Jesus got up and left the house. He went out of town to a lonely place, where He prayed. But Simon and his companions went out searching for Him, and when they found Him, they said, 'Everyone is looking for you.' But Jesus answered, 'We must go on to the other villages around here. I have to preach in them also, because that is why I came.' "Mark 1:35-38 (NIV)

DAY 1 INTERRUPTIONS is something God wants us to do?

What was Jesus doing when He was interrupted in the story from Mark 1?

He was praying! What can we do to figure out

what God wants us to do?





INTERRUPTIONS INTERRUPTIONS is something God wants us to do?

Ask yourself these questions:

Will the interruption strengthen my faith or someone else's faith in God?

Will the interruption make me more like Jesus?

Will I be a Christian example for others to follow?

If the answer to any of these questions is "yes", the interruption may be something God wants you to do!

DAY 1 INTERRUPTIONS How did Jesus handle interruptions?



Jesus was interrupted by Jairus, who pleaded for Jesus to heal his daughter.

Was Jarius' faith strengthened? YES!

Jesus responded to the interruption, and went with Jairus to help his daughter. (Mark 5:21-42)

INTERRUPTIONS How did Jesus handle interruptions?



Jesus was interrupted again by a bleeding woman who wanted to be healed.

Was the woman's faith strengthened? YES!

Jesus healed the woman.

(Mark 5:21-42)

DAY 1 INTERRUPTIONS How did Jesus handle interruptions?



Jesus continued to Jairus' house and raised his daughter from the dead. (Mark 5:21-42)
